Once a year, the state of North Carolina provides you with updates on our school's achievements through the North Carolina school report card – which includes important information about school and student performance class-size, attendance, school safety, instructional resources, and teacher quality.

I'm proud to inform you that Clover Garden earned a B letter grade, having exceeded the Department of Public Instruction's growth expectation for the 2015- 2016 school year. For the 2014-2015 school year, Clover Garden earned a C letter grade.

We exceeded growth expectations in all areas, scoring a 90.9% overall. Also, take a look at the quality teacher comparison. Clover Garden School has 93.8% fully licensed teachers compared to the state's 81%.

The numbers only tell part of the story. At Clover Garden School, we are proud of the success that we achieve every day, fulfilling our mission of fostering community, generating enthusiasm, challenging students academically, and producing successful citizens. Our success can be attributed to many things but our strong parent support and the continued encouragement from our parents is one of the keys to our success. We are proud of the expectations met and of the behaviors exemplified by our students throughout the day as they embrace our connected school.

As we continue this year, we will focus on our vision that each child will achieve success and we will hold all of our students to high expectations.
